English studies, Bachelor's degree**

1 semester

History of Britain

3 ECTS

This course covers the major political, social, and cultural events that have shaped the British Isles from early settlements to the modern era. It provides the essential historical context needed to deeply understand the evolution of English literature and the English language.

Introduction to Literary Theory

2 ECTS

This class explores the fundamental concepts, frameworks, and critical approaches used to analyze and interpret literature. Students learn to read and dissect texts through various critical lenses, such as structuralism, feminism, or post-colonialism.

Phonetics and Phonology

3 ECTS

This course examines the physical production and acoustic properties of speech sounds (phonetics) alongside the cognitive, abstract rules that govern how sounds are organized in the English language (phonology).

Pronunciation and Voice Emission

3 ECTS

A highly practical laboratory course focused on mastering spoken English accuracy, proper articulation, stress, and intonation. It is designed to help students reduce native-language interference and improve vocal clarity.

Reading and Writing Skills 1

3 ECTS

This course develops foundational academic literacy by teaching students how to critically analyze complex texts and effectively structure coherent, well-argued academic essays.

Practical Grammar 1

3 ECTS

This focuses on the intensive practice and application of English grammatical structures in both written and spoken contexts. It bridges the gap between theoretical grammar knowledge and actual communicative fluency.

Communication Skills 1

3 ECTS

Designed to enhance overall spoken fluency and active listening abilities, this course usually relies on interactive discussions, presentations, and conversational exercises.

Introduction to Linguistics

4 ECTS

This provides a broad overview of the scientific study of language, introducing core subfields like morphology (word structure), syntax (sentence structure), semantics (meaning), and language acquisition.

2 semester

Morphology and Syntax

4 ECTS

This course examines the internal structure of words and how they are formed (morphology), alongside the rules governing how words are combined into phrases and sentences (syntax). It provides a deep dive into the structural mechanics of the English language.



Semantics and Pragmatics

4 ECTS

This class explores how meaning is constructed in language, distinguishing between literal, structural meaning (semantics) and meaning derived from social context and speaker intent (pragmatics). Students learn how language functions to convey complex, nuanced messages in real-world interactions.

History of the USA

3 ECTS

This course provides a broad survey of major historical events, political movements, and social transformations in the United States from early colonization to the modern era. Understanding this historical backdrop is essential for properly contextualizing American literature and culture.

Reading and Writing Skills 2

3 ECTS

Building upon the foundational first level, this course focuses on analyzing highly complex academic texts and producing sophisticated, well-researched academic papers. It heavily emphasizes critical synthesis, advanced argumentation, and mastering academic citation conventions.

Practical Grammar 2

3 ECTS

This continuation course delves into the more nuanced, advanced, and exceptional grammatical structures of the English language. It aims to elevate students' active usage of grammar to a near-native level of precision in both writing and speaking.

Communication Skills 2

3 ECTS

A step up from the introductory course, this class focuses on advanced conversational fluency, complex debate, and professional public speaking. Students engage in rigorous interactive activities designed to build sophisticated rhetorical abilities and spontaneous communication skills.

Second Language Acquisition

4 ECTS

This course explores the psychological, cognitive, and social processes involved in learning a language other than one's mother tongue. It introduces key theories and research findings regarding how languages are acquired, which is especially valuable for students considering a career in language teaching.

3 semester

Introduction to Cultural Studies

2 ECTS

This lecture introduces students to the interdisciplinary study of cultural phenomena, focusing on how power, identity, and media shape society. Students explore theoretical frameworks to critically analyze popular culture, institutions, and everyday life.

Introduction to Discourse Analysis

2 ECTS

This lecture examines how language is used in real-life contexts to create meaning, enact power, and shape social realities. It provides students with the methodological tools to analyze both written texts and spoken conversations beyond the sentence level.

Introduction to Translation Studies

2 ECTS

This foundational lecture covers the history, theories, and fundamental concepts of translation. It introduces students to various translation strategies and the cultural or ethical considerations involved in transferring meaning across languages.



History of British Literature

2 ECTS

This survey course traces the development of British literature from its early beginnings (like Old English epics) through to modern times. It contextualizes major literary movements and canonical texts within their respective historical eras.

Seminar in British Literature

2 ECTS

This specialized, discussion-based course offers an in-depth exploration of specific British authors, genres, or thematic movements. Students engage in intensive reading, critical debate, and advanced literary research.

Effective Writing 1

2 ECTS

Designed to refine advanced writing skills, this course emphasizes clarity, coherence, and stylistic adaptability in various non-fiction and academic formats. Students practice drafting, revising, and tailoring their written communication for specific audiences.

Grammar for Language Specialists 1

3 ECTS

Moving beyond basic proficiency, this intensive module dissects complex grammatical structures specifically for future educators, translators, and linguistic professionals. It focuses on the theoretical underpinning and precise articulation of English grammar rules.

British Civilization

2 ECTS

This course explores the social, political, and institutional structures of contemporary Britain, alongside its historical development. It covers topics like the monarchy, government, media, and class systems to provide a comprehensive understanding of modern British society.

Individual Differences in Language Teaching

3 ECTS

This specialized pedagogy course investigates how variables such as age, aptitude, motivation, and learning styles impact second language acquisition. Future teachers learn to adapt their instructional methods to accommodate diverse learner profiles.

Pedagogy for English Teachers

2 ECTS

This foundational education course introduces the core methodologies, lesson planning techniques, and assessment strategies used in teaching English as a Foreign Language (TEFL). It bridges educational theory with practical classroom management skills.

Discourses of Business Environment: Linguistic Fundamentals

2 ECTS

This course analyzes the specific linguistic registers, vocabulary, and communication strategies used in the corporate world. Students learn how to navigate and produce professional business texts, negotiations, and corporate communications.

Introduction to terminology management

3 ECTS

This practical course teaches students how to systematically collect, store, and manage specialized vocabularies and glossaries. It is particularly valuable for future translators and technical writers who need to ensure consistency in specialized, technical domains.

Discourses of Culture: Language and Identity

2 ECTS

This class investigates the complex relationship between language use and the construction of personal, social, and cultural identities. Students explore how linguistic choices reflect and shape aspects of gender, ethnicity, and class.



Creative Language Practices in Contemporary Media and Popular Culture 3 ECTS

This class examines how language is creatively manipulated in modern media, advertising, social networks, and entertainment. Students analyze the stylistic and rhetorical innovations that drive contemporary pop culture communication.

4 semester

History of American Literature 2 ECTS

This course traces the evolution of American literary traditions from early colonial writings to contemporary works. It examines how major authors and literary movements reflect the changing cultural and political landscape of the United States.

Seminar in American Literature 2 ECTS

An in-depth, discussion-focused exploration of specific American authors, thematic genres, or literary periods. Students engage in critical analysis and advanced research to deeply understand specific facets of the American literary canon.

Grammar for Language Specialists 2 3 ECTS

Builds upon the first module to tackle the most complex and nuanced grammatical structures of the English language. It equips future language professionals with the expert-level syntactic knowledge needed for advanced translation, teaching, or linguistic analysis.

Effective Writing 2 2 ECTS

A continuation course that polishes advanced writing proficiency, focusing on complex rhetorical strategies and sophisticated argumentation. Students learn to master various professional and academic registers to produce highly persuasive and structurally sound texts.

American Civilization 2 ECTS

Explores the historical, political, and social institutions that define the United States, alongside its cultural values and demographics. It provides crucial context for understanding modern American society, its media, and its global influence.

Methods and Techniques of TEFL 1 2 ECTS

Introduces practical, evidence-based methodologies for Teaching English as a Foreign Language (TEFL). Students learn foundational techniques for lesson planning, developing instructional materials, and creating engaging classroom activities.

Information and Communication Technologies 3 ECTS

Covers the application of modern digital tools and software in educational, linguistic, or professional contexts. Students explore how technology can enhance language learning, aid translation processes, and streamline academic research.

Tools and methods of terminology management 2 ECTS

Building on the foundations of Introduction to Terminology Management, this computer lab-based course provides training in specialized software and organizational methodologies for extracting, classifying, and processing terminology within professional business environments.



Business correspondence and documents - writing and analysis 3 ECTS

This workshop-based course develops practical skills in English professional correspondence and business documentation by training students to analyze, draft, and adapt authentic texts according to specific stylistic standards and communicative contexts within the English-speaking corporate world.

Visual Culture and the Semiotics of Media 2 ECTS

This course explores visual and multimodal communication from the perspective of semiotics and linguistics, training students to analyze how meaning is constructed across visual media, advertising, design, and digital culture.

Media Discourse and the Politics of Language 3 ECTS

This course explores the relations between language, power, and ideology to equip students with the practical skills needed to identify and deconstruct manipulative linguistic strategies within media and political communication.

5 semester

Effective Writing 3 2 ECTS

The focus of the course is on the mechanics of clear communication, teaching students to identify and improve poorly written texts through diagnosis, analysis, and paraphrasing. Students will demonstrate their mastery of an effective, transparent writing style through presentations, practical exercises, and a final knowledge test.

Methods and Techniques of TEFL 2 3 ECTS

This class equips students with the essential skills to teach both receptive and productive English language skills by tailoring methods and materials to individual learning styles and modalities. It emphasizes practical material creation, the integration of educational technology (ICT), and the development of critical self-reflection to effectively analyze and meet the specific needs of language learners.

ELT Materials Design and Evaluation 3 ECTS

The aim of this course is to prepare students to effectively plan and conduct English lessons by focusing heavily on the selection, evaluation, and practical application of various teaching materials. Students will learn how to critically assess textbooks, digital resources, and supplementary aids, developing strong criteria for choosing the best educational tools for their classrooms.

Human Resources Management 3 ECTS

This course introduces essential Human Resources Management concepts while expanding students' specialized vocabulary and understanding of workplace communication. Taught interactively, the classes rely on discussions, group work, and the analysis of real-world case studies and audiovisual materials.

Marketing and Advertising 3 ECTS

This course teaches key concepts in marketing, advertising, and public relations using English source texts, including the foundational works of Philip Kotler. Students will practically apply this knowledge by building specialized glossaries and analyzing real-world case studies to understand how various organizations use marketing communication to build brands and persuade audiences.

Critical Reading & Writing: British Literature 3 ECTS



This class explores recurring themes in British literature—such as race, class, identity, power, or trauma—by applying literary theory to the in-depth analysis and interpretation of specific texts. The exact thematic focus is chosen by the professor, allowing students to critically examine how these complex issues are represented within their specific cultural contexts.

Critical Reading & Writing: American Literature

3 ECTS

Much like the British literature module, this instructor-led course explores recurring themes in American literature—such as race, identity, power, and trauma—by applying literary theory to the in-depth analysis of specific texts. The exact thematic focus is determined by the professor, allowing students to critically examine how these complex issues are represented within their specific American cultural contexts.

6 semester

Language Testing and Assessment

3 ECTS

This course teaches students the practical skills needed for effective language assessment, including how to design, administer, and evaluate educational tests. Additionally, students will learn how to select appropriate grading techniques and apply various examination strategies.

Linguistic Mediation in Practice

3 ECTS

Aligned with the CEFR framework, this course focuses on the practical development of language mediation and intercultural communication skills within English language teaching. Students will use educational technology (ICT) to design their own teaching materials aimed at helping learners effectively explain and interpret verbal and non-verbal texts across different cultures.

Principles of Brand Management

3 ECTS

Building on introductory marketing principles, this course teaches students how to create, promote, and protect an organization's brand through effective communication strategies. Students will actively track real-world brands and analyze how their images adapt to changing economic environments across various communication channels.

Social Media

3 ECTS

This course explores the professional application of various social media platforms, teaching students to analyze existing media campaigns that promote organizational innovation. Working both individually and collaboratively, students will then apply these insights to design and launch their own modern digital communication strategies.

Literary Criticism: From Theory to Practice

3 ECTS

Building upon foundational knowledge from previous coursework, this advanced class trains students in the complex application of modern literary theory. Students will read, analyze, and present academic texts that use literary frameworks to explore broader phenomena within the contemporary humanities, with specific readings curated based on the professor's unique research expertise.

Literature and Culture: Authoring Content

3 ECTS

In this course, students conduct an in-depth analysis of a significant, recurring phenomenon within English-language literature and culture, viewed through a specific contemporary critical or theoretical lens. The exact thematic scope is tailored by the professor based on their unique research expertise and academic specialization.
